As the world around us is rapidly adapting to the impact of the COVID-19 virus we at Church at Prison, Inc. have been lead to do a new thing to serve those who are incarcerated in Vermont prisons. With more cases of the virus still popping up inside the state prison facilities the outlook of volunteer services returning to the prisons is still far off. Our beloved flocks have been in a state of modified to full lock down, sequestered to the confines of their cell with little access to the gospel of Jesus Christ. The Lord has put on our hearts to adapt temporarily to serve and encourage our brothers and sisters behind bars. In September Pastor Josh Riggs started recording a United Prison Ministries of Vermont weekly church service, on DVD's, for all of the facilities in Vermont to play on Sundays for the inmates. This is a united effort that all the prison ministers throughout the state have been participating in. It includes prayer, encouragement, sermons, prophetic words and worship. Our prayer is that this blesses both the inmates who believe as well as evangelize non-believers! So far the feedback has been encouraging.
